
Pre-Meeting Panel Discussion

Manufactured Home Park Tenancy Act (MHPTA)

At the 2016 AGM concerns were raised abou the MHPTA. As per the consensus of the membership regarding the emphasis on this topic and implications thereof, a motion was passed to cease any current action and investigate affordability/sustainability issues more broadly.


2016 Election of FHA Board of Directors


In the 2016 election, 13 individuals were nominated to the board. Three of those elected were later deemed ineligible, and during the course of the year, two dropped off due to personal/family reasons.


Membership Survey


The board produced a survey to determine issues and priorities of importance to the membership and other floating home stakeholders. There were 117 respondents from 15 floating home communities or jurisdictions. The Ladner area represented about 50% of those who responded, and in total, 45% of respondents self identified as paid members, the other 55% as non-members. Through cross-tab evaluation, it was determined that there was no statistically significant difference between the answers

provided by members, vs. non-members. This first survey will provide a benchmark against which we can measure our progress. The intention is that the board will repeat the survey every two years. Data of note was shared with the membership in the following slides:

Communications Report - Sandy McKellar


Sandy manages the communications activities and outreach for the Association and provided some updates on the activities of the last year.

Slides in the presentation included a snapshot of the handout created for use in meetings with government representatives. Screen captures from the website launched in July of 2016, including visitor statistics and an interactive map of floating home locations in BC (still under construction), an extensive photo gallery, and other helpful resources.

Three newsletters were sent out in 2016 with more anticipated for 2017.

Other tech and social media examples included the new online membership registration, successful Facebook page, and outreach.











6. RESOLUTIONS

Resolution #1



Frank Archer moved to approve the new bylaws of the Societies Act

Motion seconded by Judy Pierce. All were in favour, the motion is carried.

Resolution #2



Frank Archer moved to amend the bylaws of the Floating Home Association Pacific

Motion seconded by Butch Nelson.

- -Question was raised about when the proposed resolutions were distributed and Sandy McKellar explained that they were on the FHA website, and referenced in the Mail Chimp message that was sent to membership on April 5th, 2017.
- -Question was raised about removal of a director from the board who misses two or more meeting without cause. After

some discussion, Clive Welham moved that the following amendment be made to the updated bylaws as presented, such that they would read, "In order for the board of directors to removed a fellow director for missing two or more meetings without cause, the vote must be unanimous and include all remaining members of the board." Seconded by Robin Telford. Carried

Question was raised about why the board should determine the executive positions. This was explained by Sandy Mckellar and accepted by the questioner.

The vote was called and the motion was carried.

Annual Membership Dues

Motion By Dave Coulter: BE IT RESOLVED by Resolution, the membership of Floating Home Association Pacific approve a \$10 (ten dollars) increase in annual membership fees from the present \$15 (fifteen dollars) to \$25 (twenty-five dollars). Further, the membership fee will apply only to an individual member and not provide for a household membership.

Dave Coulter moved to increase the individual membership dues for the Floating Home Association Pacific by \$10, from the present \$15/yr to \$25/yr.

Motion seconded by Butch Nelson. Carried.
